Emens 1983, served on the field staff of the international Fraternity as chapter leadership consultants; therefore **Be It Resolved** that on this occasion we celebrate the chapter's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary, that the Arch Chapter, on behalf of the Fraternity and of all Delts, wherever dispersed throughout the world, sends its greetings and congratulations on this grand occasion and,
