

Finding the Stories in His Own Backyard

Brother Jake Appleman '06 Follows Brooklyn's First Major Sports Franchise Since the Dodgers

On February 4, 2014, a new book hit the stands (and, Amazon, of course). An account of the highs and lows of the Brooklyn Nets' historic first season (2012) in the borough, *Brooklyn Bounce* by Brother **Jake Appleman '06** has been described as "a breezy, cautionary tale for modern sports fans in an era in which money trumps all, and owners who know nothing about the NBA meddle destructively." The paperback version was released on the book's one-year anniversary. We caught up with the native New Yorker to learn more about his inspiration behind the book and his days at Chi Chapter.

Tell us about your professional journey. I did a high school senior project in which I



went to Nets games in East Rutherford, N.J., and wrote about the games from the stands. While at Kenyon, I covered the Cleveland Cavaliers for *SLAM Magazine* — often borrowing cars from generous Chi members for the two-hour drive north. I then covered the Nets for NBA.com when the team moved from East Rutherford to Newark. Along the way, I wrote for *The New York Times*, *GQ* and ESPN.com. In 2012, an agent suggested that I write a book about the Nets' first season in Brooklyn. The hardcover came out a year ago, the paperback earlier this year.


What inspired your interest in Nets' basketball? I was always a huge NBA fan growing up. The Nets provided a good counterpoint to the Knicks, a different viewing experience, both on TV and at the games.

What is one thing you learned during the writing of the book that surprised you?

I learned that Deron Williams, the Nets' point guard and main character of the book, was born to two parents who played basketball at West Liberty State College (now West Liberty University) which is located a few miles down the road from Bethany College where DTD was founded.

What are some of the highlights of your journey while writing the book?

A seven-city, 13-day road trip stands out. Spending time in Vegas while trying to cobble together material for sample chapters before the project was sold was fun. Jay-Z's concert that officially opened Barclays Center had a special feel to it.

KENYON HIGHLIGHTS

State of Greek Life at Kenyon College

According to the Dean of Students Office at Kenyon College, approximately "25 percent of Kenyon students become member of Greek associations."

While we know our Delt brotherhood is doing well (e.g., average GPA in line with the all-fraternity and all-male averages on campus), what else is happening in the Greek community at Kenyon?



- Kenyon has eliminated the point deduction for the housing lottery for fraternity members who choose to live in division housing their sophomore year. This change eliminates a significant deterrent for fraternity membership and is welcome news for the fraternity system at Kenyon.

- The Phi Kappa Tau fraternity colony has been approved as a full chapter and will be installed April 25.
- The Kappa Sigma Alpha sorority will become a full chapter of national sorority Alpha Sigma Tau and will be installed April 19.
- The Zeta Alpha Pi sorority has announced to the campus community that it is also considering affiliating with a national sorority.
- Peeps O' Kenyon has decided to no longer be recognized as a Greek organization on campus. They will retain their division housing in Old Kenyon.
