Brother Peter Dolan '81 is Paying it Forward to Give Something Back

Each Brother's experience at DTD is unique. As Brother's come in and out Middle Leonard with their own life experiences, they each bring something different to the table that helps mold their experience into what it's meant to be. It is a privilege that so many have come through our doors, and it is a victory that so many leave prepared to lead a better life because of their time as a Delt.

Peter Dolan '81 is now retired and "living the dream" in Minnesota. But more than four decades ago, he was spending 1977-1981 as a Delt, and his experience was as unforgettable as many of ours. It was a time in his life when he had little in the way of resources, and the school administrators and DTD organization offered him support he is eternally grateful for. Because of his situation when he came to DTD, his gratitude to the school and the DTD organization runs deep. Now, as a lifetime contributor, he's hoping to



pay it forward by giving something back.

"I contribute to the Delt Fund because I feel I owe the DTD organization so much, especially financially," Dolan '81 says. "My parents did not have the resources to send me to Kenyon, much less pay for me to join campus organizations. All I had was the money from my summer job and the little bit I earned lifeguarding and teaching swim

lessons at Schafer Pool. The Delts honored me by letting me be a part of their great organization, and I tried to pay my dues through chores and any artwork they may have needed. I never felt they were getting a fair return on their money so I made a promise to Doc Burns that I would pay them back some day, so I have decided be a lifetime contributor."

Dolan '81 left Chi Chapter with a greater sense of belonging and a true understanding of Brotherhood. It was, he says,

the most valuable part of his experiences. The Brotherhood and the "sense of belonging to, and contributing to, something greater than one's self." It is our hope that the active Brothers at Chi Chapter today feel the same way – that they truly belong and they understand the Brotherhood they are now part of for life.

KENYON DELTS IN THE NEWS

Kenyon Delts are making headlines this year!



Charlie Walch '89 is currently CEO of Pluton Biosciences, a company based out of St. Louis. The startup recently acquired a local research laboratory, Microbe Inotech Laboratories (MiL), and will make that research and testing lab part of Pluton's new division. MiL brings with it more than 100 customers and provides services for the environmental, food safety, industrial, pharmaceutical, plant science and government sectors. Founded in 2017, Pluton has developed a new process that allows it to inexpensively examine soil microorganisms to discover new bacteria, fungi and viruses. For example, Pluton's first finding was a patent-

pending bacteria that can kill mosquitos carrying deadly disease like yellow fever and Zika.

Great job on heading up this important work, Charlie!

Another member of the class of 1989 (Way to go, guys! Must've been something in the water at the Chi house that year...) is making headlines in a completely different way. **CR Obetz '89** was recently featured in *Portfolio Magazine*, a Naples-based publication that focuses on golfing, art, business, leisure and lifestyle topics. 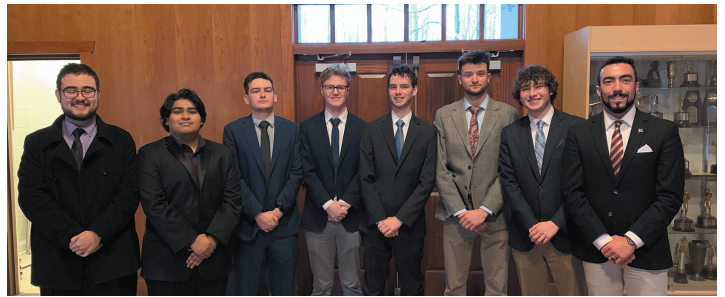

About the Robert D. Burns Scholarship: Established in 2010 by alumni of Delta Tau Delta Fraternity in honor of professor emeritus and long-time Delta Tau Delta faculty adviser, Robert D. Burns. The income from the fund provides support to junior or senior students who are members in good standing of Delta Tau Delta Fraternity. The income shall be used to reduce the loan component in the financial aid package but not to replace any previously awarded scholarship grants or financial aid awards. In addition to financial need, preference shall be given to individuals who promote the ideals of Delta Tau Delta Fraternity, including: academic excellence, involvement in the Fraternity and Kenyon community, leadership, and strong character.
